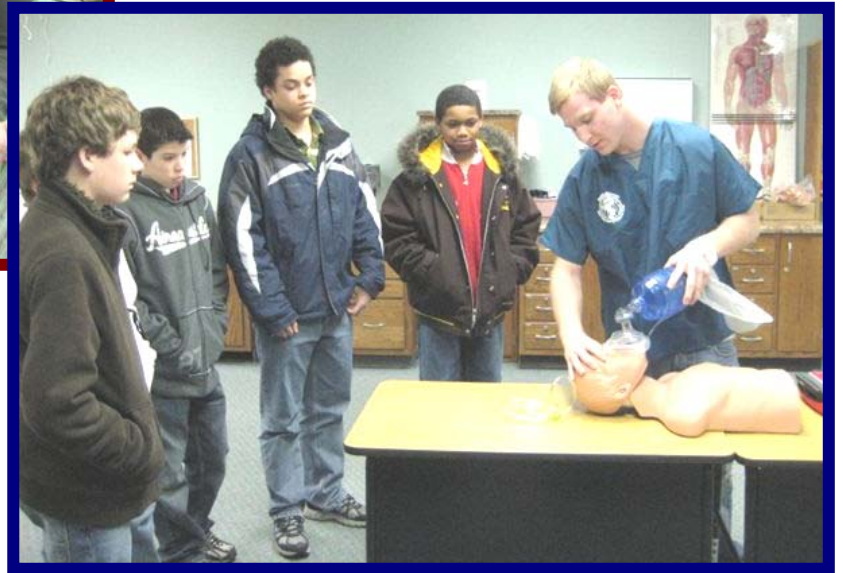
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Career Center Students Show their Skills to Valparaiso Middle School Students

We are planning to install both a wind generator and a solar collector this school year as an alternative energy demonstration project. Mr. Kenning, our Electronic teacher, is our lead teacher on the project but he will also be using the resources of our Modern Machining and Computer Assisted Design classes. Our students will be building, installing, monitoring, and evaluating the systems as part of their learning. We will have electronic instruments that will show visitors the amount of alternative power produced through our projects.
