Sign up for Industrial Mechanics if you are interested in a welding or manufacturing career.

First-year students will first learn printing reading, turning, milling and grinding. They will then focus on basic welding processes, which include oxyacetylene, stick welding, wire welding and TIG welding, plus operation of plasma arc machines.

The industrial mechanic is the key problem solver in the workplace. Industrial mechanics install machinery, use precision measuring devices and operate complex tools in a variety of manufacturing environments.

Second- year students will cover the basic competencies necessary to become employed in industry. Competencies include hydraulics, pneumatics, burning, print reading, power transmission, lubrication, pumps, piping, rigging, shop equipment and mechanical maintenance. The first semester will consist of classroom and lab instruction at Portage High in the defined competencies. The second year includes an internship (for approved students) in an area manufacturing facility.



CTE HELPS STUDENTS Earn Diplomas

Besides preparing you for work and further education, a Career and Tech Ed class can be just the thing you need to earn your Indiana diploma.

The Indiana Graduation Pathways initiative requires students starting with the Class of 2023 to complete a series of steps beyond subjects required for graduation.

Current freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors can also use participation in CTE classes to document work-based learning and to prove they are ready to graduate high school.

A "C" average or better in a CTE pathway- makes you a "CTE concentrator" for graduation. See your home school counselor to customize your plan for graduation.

Then there's the matter of dual college credits. Most CTE classes give students a chance to earn three to 18 college credits, for free, in a year's time.

And there are industry-recognized certifications, such as Certified Nursing Assistant, Emergency Medical Technician, Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) and more.

We hear a comment all the time from well-meaning adults: "Well, not everyone is meant to go to college" as they endorse Career and Technical Education.

Actually, that sentiment does NOT describe our students. Most of our CTE students go on for further training at a university, college, community college, apprenticeship program or trade school. Their CTE class helps them decide what they do like to do and what they do not like to do as they prepare for the future. They might even be saving money on higher education by exploring during high school.

A CTE teacher just might end up being your favorite educator. CTE teachers are typically handson experts in their fields. They know what it is like to work in industry and commerce, but they also love to share their knowledge with students.

They love having a chance to work with fairly small groups of enthusiastic students for extended periods of time.

How can I earn a Core 40 with Technical Honors Diploma? (47 credits)

Complete all requirements for Core 40.

- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College & Career Pathway and one of the following:
 - 1. Pathway designated industry-based certification or credential, or
 - 2. Pathway dual credits from the lists of priority courses resulting in 6 transcripted college credits
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following,
 - 1. Any one of the options (A F) of the Core 40 with Academic Honors.
 - 2. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Accuplacer: Writing 80, Reading 90, Math 75.
 - 3. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Compass: Algebra 66, Writing 70, Reading 80.



Can I earn college credit by attending career and technical education programs?

Almost all Porter County Career and Technical classes have dual credit opportunities. Many of our students leave high school with transcripted credits from Indiana University Northwest, Ivy Tech Community College and/or Vincennes University. These credits could help a student earn the Indiana Technical Honors and/or Academic Honors Diploma. We also have relationships with numerous proprietary, trade or professional schools.

Can I fulfill an Indiana graduation pathway by taking a half-day CTE class?

Yes. Getting a C average in a one-year, half-day CTE class can qualify you to earn a pathway through the Class of 2022. Starting with the Class of 2023, two advanced classes are needed. See your school counselor to customize your plan.

Can career and technical education courses help prepare me for industry certification examinations?

Career and technical education curriculum is developed based upon state, national, and business and industry certification standards. Programs provide students the opportunity to develop the knowledge and skills in preparation for industry certification standards such as: American Society of Welders (AWS), Automotive Service Excellence (ASE), Certified Nursing Assistance (CNA), Student Electronics Technician (SET), Indiana Cosmetology License, Certified Dental Assistant (CDA), Cisco Certified Networking Associate (CCNA) and Child Development Associate credential (CDA). These are not simple assessments, but earning a certain industry can help you fulfill an Indiana graduation pathway.

Is transportation provided to all career and technical programs?

Most schools provide school bus transportation to the Porter County Career and Technical Center. However, other programs may require the student to provide personal transportation to and from his/her home school. Students involved in a work-based experience program will be required to provide transportation because of the training station (job) component during or after school hours. The best way to find out if transportation is provided is to ask your guidance counselor.

What costs are involved with taking a CTE class?

PCCTE and the public high school you attend (Boone Grove, Chesterton, Hebron, Hobart, Kouts, Morgan, Portage, Valparaiso, Washington or Wheeler) make your class possible. Expect to pay for some book rental, workbooks and possibly some miscellaneous lab fees. Certain fees are waived for those receiving lunch/book assistance. The highest out-of-pocket fees are associated with Cosmetology.

Classes such as Emergency Medical Services and Health Science Education II require transportation to clinical assignments.
